



## Clarence Ray Marble

May 13, 1936 - February 3, 2013

Clarence Ray Marble was born to William Martin “Pat” and Ada Belle (Davis) Marble in Warren, Oklahoma on May 13, 1936 and departed this life in Lexington, Oklahoma on February 3, 2013 at the age of 76 years, 8 months and 21 days.

Clarence grew up in Warren, OK and graduated from Blair High School in 1954. Clarence married Glenda Waller on October 3, 1960 in Mangum, Oklahoma. He worked as a heavy equipment operator, at the OSU experiment farm south of Altus, OK then he served in the US Army and spent two years in Germany.
