Betty Lou Nippert passed away on December 15, 2016 in Mangum at the age of 89. Betty was born on September 18, 1927 to Odessa May (Harkins) and Halfard R. Hamilton in Tupelo, Oklahoma. At the age of one, Betty moved with her family to Plainview (Erick, OK). Betty started to school at Sunny Slope, a one-room school. After fourth grade, Betty and her brothers and sisters rode the bus to the new Plainview school just completed by the WPA. Betty graduated as salutatorian from Plainview in 1946. She married Junior Nippert on August 24, 1946. Betty and Junior had one son, Gary. In 1953, shortly after Gary was born, they moved from Plainview to Mangum. Betty was a long time member of the First Baptist Church in Mangum. She enjoyed quilting, embroidery and playing a good game of Wahoo. She was always ready to go with Junior; whether it be to the farm, to Branson or on Armco business. Betty loved her home and enjoyed sharing it with friends and family.
