Carrell “Cat” Leon Coffman, age 85, passed from this life on September 15, 2015 in Blanchard, Oklahoma. Cat was born on September 13, 1930 in Mangum, Oklahoma to Corbin Coffman and Lorene Gertrude (Brooks) Coffman. From the age of nine “Cat” was raised and loved by who he considered his Dad, Ora Jay Wheeler. Cat in his early years attended school in Lake Creek and Retrop and then attended Lone Wolf High School. He then joined the United States Navy, serving three years, nine months and twenty seven days, during the Korean War. Cat married the love of his life Madoline Joyce Wilson on September 8, 1951 in Yuma, Arizona. To this union were born three children, Anita, Sandy and Troy. “Cat” was a man who could do just about anything. After his honorable discharge, he continued to work for the government at Fort Sill in Civil Service as an electrician for twenty years,” Cat was a self-trained and brilliant electrician, then went on to welding school and received his welding certificate and was a barber in Roosevelt for many years. Cat was an avid coon hunter and quail hunter, “Cat made his own shells for hunting quail”, when the season came around he was ready. Cat was a member of the Church of Christ. Mr. Coffman was preceded in death by his parents, his Dad, Ora Wheeler, two brothers Doyal and Harold Coffman. Cat is survived by his wife Madoline of the home in Roosevelt, two daughters, Anita Kliever and husband Charles of Blanchard, Ok, Sandy Jackson of Caddo Mills, Texas, one son, Troy Coffman of Elk City, Oklahoma, one brother: Darris Wheeler and wife Natalie of Martha, Okla., two sisters: Verna Standefer of
