



Delbert Leroy Taylor

October 26, 1939 - December 28, 2017

Delbert Leroy Taylor, born October 26, 1939, at Eddy, Oklahoma to Lee Elmer Taylor and Bonita May Tabor Taylor. He passed from this life to his heavenly life with Jesus on December 28, 2017, at the age of 78 years, 2 months and 2 days. He was the fifth of six children in his family. He lived in the Lamont, OK area all his life until leaving for college. He attended school at Lamont and graduated from Lamont High School in 1957. At that time he went to Oklahoma Baptist University, Shawnee, OK, where he got his degree in English. He gave his life to Christ at eight years of age, and at sixteen, he felt God's call to be a preacher. From then on, that was his goal. He married Lois Irene Constant in August, 1959, and they continued their education at OBU. After his graduation from OBU in 1961, they moved to Lamont where he taught English for one year. Then, they continued their education at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Ft. Worth, TX where he earned a Bachelor of Divinity Degree in 1966. He pastored churches in Braman, OK, Marysville, TX, and Olustee, OK. While in seminary, he and his wife answered God's call to be foreign missionaries. They were appointed missionaries by the International Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention in October, 1968. That led to 33 years of service in Colombia and Ecuador, South America where they started and helped develop churches. It was a joy for him to see people trust in Jesus as Lord. He retired in November, 2001. Since then, he made his home in Mangum where he was active with family, church, friends, and horseback competitions.

In high school Delbert lettered in football and basketball at Lamont. While in college, Delbert lettered all four years in track. In Colombia, South America, he became involved in bicycle road racing which led to many contacts and friendships as well as prizes and trophies. His horseback competitions won him many prizes including two saddles. His eternal prizes are those hearts given to Christ through his ministry.

Delbert is survived by his wife, Lois, of the home, daughter, Loy Del Sawyer and husband Johnny Sawyer of Bartlesville, daughter Kandy Kay Medlock and husband George Medlock of Altus, son Delbert Lance Taylor and wife Carisa Taylor of Mangum, He is also survived by his brother J. W. Taylor and wife, Ruth, of Mississippi, and his sister Shelba Judd and husband Earl Judd of Claremore, OK. He is survived by eight grandchildren: Marissa Sawyer, Kristin Kime , Matthew Medlock, Mandy O'Neil, Marcus Medlock, Andrew Taylor, Jordan Taylor, and Courtney Taylor, and five living great-grandchildren, Taylor Giles, Jack O'Neil, Pearl Medlock, Lanie O'Neil, and Gunner Medlock. He was preceded in death by his father, mother, two brothers, one sister, and one great-grandson.

Funeral Services for Delbert are scheduled for Saturday, December 30, 2017, 3:00 P.M. at Martha Road Baptist Church with Pastor Kevin Baker officiating and Pastor J.V. Lobaugh assisting. Interment will follow at Riverside Cemetery Mangum, OK.
