



## Floyd James Willoughby

October 10, 1931 - February 28, 2017

Floyd James Willoughby passed from this life in Altus, Oklahoma on February 28, 2017, at the age of 85. He was born on October 10, 1931, in Brinkman, Oklahoma, to Jessie Floyd Willoughby and Julia (Norton) Willoughby. Floyd grew up on the farm in Brinkman and began plowing at the age of seven. In 1949, the Willoughby family moved to Vinson, Oklahoma, where Floyd attended school. On November 1, 1951, Floyd married the girl he would begin a family with and who would be his wife of 66 years, Toyah Shirleen Willoughby. Floyd farmed and worked in the oil field until the children reached a certain age, when he began his work as a correctional officer at the Oklahoma State Reformatory, from where he retired after 20+ years of service. After retirement, he began to work on a farm to stay busy. He was a proud Mason and a member of the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma A.F. & A.M. in Altus Lodge #62 for 44 years. In his younger days, Floyd enjoyed fishing and camping while taking road trips with his family to other states and lakes around Oklahoma, chasing storms with the kids, going to yard sales, and he always had a large garden to tend. Floyd was a very creative, intelligent individual who would do anything for his kids, and his southern ingenuity was something to behold. He always said, "boredom is a state of mind".

Floyd is survived by his wife, Toyah, of the home; Daughter, Paula Shirleen Snow of Edmond; Son, Barton Floyd Willoughby and wife Lacy of Granite; Brother Austin and wife Patsy of Wellington; Brother Jessie of Amarillo; Sister

Joann and husband Anthony of Stillwater; Sister Alice and husband Joe of Hollis, and Sister Willie Mae, and husband Bob of Hollis. He was preceded in death by his parents, brothers Frankie and Troy, his children, Baby James Willoughby, and Baby Jane Willoughby, and son-in-law, Gary Snow. Floyd leaves a legacy of 7 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren and is also survived by a host of other relatives and friends. He will be greatly missed.
