



Garrett Lee Sutton

September 10, 1922 - February 27, 2023

Garrett Lee Sutton passed from this life February 27, 2023 in Hobart, Oklahoma at 100 years of age. Garrett was born to John Garrett and Fannie Elinore (Daubenmire) Sutton on September 10, 1922, in Thurston, Ohio. Garrett grew up in Thurston, Ohio and Fairfield County. He was a graduate of Thurston High School. He lived in San Antonio, Altus and Hobart. In September 1940 he entered the Army Air Corp for nine years, serving in the CBI Theatre in WWII, Korea, Vietnam and two tours in Japan, flying over 12,000 miles, receiving many honored metals and accommodations, then joined United States Air Force as a flight engineer and master mechanic. He served 33 years in the Air force, retiring in 1973 as Chief Master Sergeant at Altus Air Force Base. On March 20, 1999, he married Frances Evelyn (Odell) Lafever.

He was a member of the Washington Street First Baptist Church in Hobart, Masonic Lodge – 1105, San Antonio, Scottish Rite Valley of Guthrie, York Rite, Elk City, Shriners India Temple of Oklahoma City, Eastern Star Chapter 734, San Antonio, American Legion post 117, Hobart, Life Member National Rifle Association and the Whittington Center Gun Club, Raton, New Mexico.

Garrett is survived by his wife Frances Evelyn Sutton of Hobart, daughters, Donna Kay Perkins and husband Tom of San Antonio, TX, Kathi Sue McDonald of Spring Branch, Texas, sister, Dorothy Ellen Mooney and husband Tom of Thurston, Ohio, stepson, Dale Lafever and wife Jeannie of Lone Wolf, OK, stepdaughter, Diane Clark and husband Lex of Duncan.

Garret leaves a legacy of grandchildren and great grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends.

He is preceded in death by his parents, John Garrett and Fannie Elinore (Daubemire) Sutton, one sister, Beulah and son-in-law Dicky McDonald.
