



Glenna Rae Graumann

April 15, 1946 - December 17, 2017

Glenna Rae (Duncan) Graumann, age 71, passed away Sunday, December 17, 2017, surrounded by her family at Grace Living Center in Mangum, Oklahoma after an extended battle with lymphoma.

Glenna was born at Jackson County Memorial Hospital to Ira and Reba Duncan on April 15, 1946. During her childhood she and her sister, Gwyn, attended schools in Oklahoma City where their father was a civil service employee at Tinker Air Force Base and in Altus where he served as a dispatcher/jailer for the Altus Police Department. Glenna also attended Duke Schools for a short time. She graduated from Altus Schools in 1964. Glenna was a member for many years of St. John's Lutheran Church, Lone Wolf, Oklahoma.

After graduation, Glenna attended cosmetology school in Altus. She also met the love of her life, Johnny Graumann, and they married on July 28, 1965 in Vernon, Texas.

Glenna was a full-time mother and homemaker and also worked many years as a cosmetologist, both as an instructor and as an independent contractor. She also worked several years for the former Duke Times.

Glenna was very dedicated to her family. She made sure Johnny had everything he needed for his weeks on the road as a truck driver and that he was comfortable and well-fed when he came home on weekends. She was a constant presence at school and church activities for Cheryl and Melissa. When the next generation began arriving, she was equally dedicated to being

present in their lives.

Glenna was preceded in death by her mother and father, by two nephews: Robert Hopkins and Alan Graumann, by one niece: Shelly Hopkins, by two brothers-in-law: Rayford Hopkins and Larry Graumann and by one great-grandchild: baby Tripp.

Glenna is survived by her husband, Johnny, her daughter Cheryl Millard, her daughter Melissa Tripp and husband Scott. She is also survived by her sister Gwyn Hopkins and by her nephew Ira Hopkins of Granite.

She is survived by her grandchildren, Lesley Baker and husband Douglas of Altus, Ethan Millard of Altus, Tanner Tripp of Blair, Rhett Tripp and Kyanna Clift of Altus and Joe Tripp of Blair plus one great-granddaughter, Madeleine June Baker of Altus. She is also survived by many other precious family members.

A private memorial was held for Glenna in the home of her daughter and son-in-law Melissa and Scott Tripp on Wednesday, December 20, 2017 and was officiated by Pastor B. J. Armstrong, nephew of Glenna, and Chaplain Erin Martinez from JCMH Hospice.
