His Managerial and leadership skills were quickly recognized and was promoted to manager and reassigned to Tulsa, Oklahoma. After many years in the corporate world, Dave became an entrepreneur owning a plane

leasing company, owning and operating two Tulsa cafés and the first Goldie's in Tulsa. He then built and operated Shadow Mountain Inn, a premier steakhouse in Tulsa where he became a self-taught chef. He could cook the perfect steak and the most delicious chicken fingers. It was during this time he began traveling to Grand Lake, Oklahoma and quickly knew this is where he wanted to live the rest of his life.

After moving to Grand Lake, he became a contractor building residential areas, tennis courts, commercial businesses and Cedar Port Marina. He owned and operated two grocery stores, in Ketchum, and Langley, Oklahoma. He built and operated the Security Center (a residential and commercial alarm company) until he retired in the late 90's. He was the Mayor of Langley, Ok and also served as a judge. There is a street named after him in Disney, Ok and a monument recognizing him at the entrance of the Langley Public Building. His contributions to the growth and development in the Grand Lake area are a tribute to his business successes.

Dave was a midget car racer, a skilled pilot, an avid champion golfer, an excellent bridge and poker player and an enthusiastic Oklahoma University Boomer Sooner football fan. When granddaughter Olivia chose to attend OSU, Dave bought a "house divided" OU/OSU flag for our home. He enjoyed traveling, boating on Grand Lake, fine dining, spending time with family and friends, listening to country music, visiting with neighbors, watching westerns and CNBC Squawk Box, He was proud to be an American and wholeheartedly supported "Wounded Warriors". A more generous man would be hard to find as Dave helped many friends and family members throughout his lifetime. He will be remembered for his loving generosity and his wonderful sense of humor. He was my Hero, my friend, my husband and partner and the "love of my life". . It was a privilege and honor to have known Dave Wall and shared 30 years with him.
