Harry Lynn Petzold was born to Ewalt and Selma (Kruse) Petzold in Butler, Texas on October 20, 1926 and departed this life in Hobart, Oklahoma on May 1, 2012 at the age of 85 years, 6 months and 11 days.

Harry moved to the Altus area when he was 11 with his family and attended the City View and Ozark Schools before being drafted into the Army for WWII. After he spent his time in the Army he married Dorothy Heien on October 24, 1948 in Lone Wolf, OK, and they made their home in Lone Wolf. Harry was a farmer and an Honorary Life Member of the Lone Wolf FFA, the Kiowa Fair Board, the Southwest Sandyland Research Station and the St. John's Lutheran Church of Granite, OK.

He was preceded in death by his parents; 3 brothers, Elmo, LeRoy and Gilford "Butch" Petzold; and a sister, Norma Jean Campbell.
