John Marvin Owen was born on March 20, 1930, in Granite, Oklahoma, to Jo Ella Bowles and Tom Owen. He passed away on December 31, 2021, at the age of 91 in Stillwater, Oklahoma. John grew up in Mangum, Oklahoma, and faithfully served his country in the National Guard 45th infantry division. While in Korea, John drove a tank for 18 months and was honorably discharged with a rank of Sergeant. Upon his return to Willow, Oklahoma, John graduated high school in 1951 and attended college at the Sayre Junior College and Midwestern State University.

In 1959, John married the love of his life, Ethel Imogene “Jean” Owen and became a father to her three children, Iwanna Jean, Virginia, and Edgar, Jr. In 1963, John and Jean welcomed their daughter, Jeannie Suzanne, to their family.

John’s career began at the Willow Co-Op where he served as a bookkeeper and then manager. From there, John worked as a hospital administrator in both Elk City and Mangum. He then became office manager at Greer’s Funeral Home and then People’s Cooperative Funeral Home in Lone Wolf. At the age of 82, John retired to care for his dear wife who was aging in years. In 2015, they made their way to Stillwater, Oklahoma, to be near their daughter and her family.

John was a devoted Christian, husband, father, and grandfather. He is remembered for his service, faithfulness, wisdom, selflessness, and strength. A crafted musician, John was able to pick up any instrument and beautifully

play them. John also loved to read and was skilled with technology. Most of all, John enjoyed spending time with his family and serving as a song leader and deacon at the Willow Church of Christ.

Preceding him in death were his beloved wife, Jean; his parents; one brother, Tommy; two sisters, Nita and Margie; two daughters, Jean Duncan and Virginia Johnson; and one grandson, Kirk Duncan.

John is survived by his children, Edgar Moore, Jr. and wife Clarice of Temecula, CA, Suzanne Birdwell and husband Richard of Stillwater, OK; 10 grandchildren, over 20 great-grandchildren, and a host of other relatives and friends.

Graveside Services for John are scheduled for Tuesday, January 4, 2022, 1:30 P.M. at the Willow Cemetery with Ken Hamilton officiating. The United States Army Honor Guard will perform graveside rites.
