March 3, 1942 - May 26, 2021

Larry Eldon Ware passed from this life on May 26, 2021 in Mangum at age 79. He was born on March 3, 1942 in Wellington, Texas to Emmett Allen Ware and Annie Aderine (Ashcraft) Ware. Larry spent his school years in Wellington and after graduation he continued his education at West Texas State University receiving his bachelor's degree in education with a minor in Russian Geography in 1972. Larry married the love of his life Rose Marie Parkhill on December 17, 1965 in Amarillo, Texas and to this union they were blessed with four children: Everett, Clayton, Alyce and Marcell. He went on to have a career with the Department of Labor working in Texas and then being transferred to the Oklahoma City Federal Building just prior to the bombing. He was a survivor, helping many people out of the building. It changed his life. While Larry enjoyed quail, dove and deer hunting, fishing as well, he became a fisher of men. He was involved in the Sooner Prison ministry for over 20 years, changing peoples lives one at a time. Larry and Rose were also members of the Church of Christ in Granite.

Larry is survived by his wife Rose of the home, two sons: Everett Ware of Ft. Worth and Clayton Ware and wife Kelly of Arlington. Two daughters: Alyce Chamberlain of Amarillo and Marcell Brown and husband Dan of Iowa Park, Texas, sister Laverne Hiatt of Borger, Texas, two sister-in-laws Rebecca Gwyn of Amarillo and Myrt Ware of Spearman, Texas.

He leaves a legacy of seven grandchildren: Whitney, Brooks, Elysia, Daniel, Dahlia, Maralyn Rose and Madison. Great-grandchildren: Benson, Brody,

Xavier, Bryanna, Ember and one on the way. Larry is also survived by a host of other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents Emmett and Annie Ware and his brother Wayne Ware.
