



Lee Carl Sparkman

October 13, 1946 - May 20, 2026

A man of few words but great presence, Lee Carl Sparkman was called home on May 20, 2026, at the age of 79, leaving behind a silence deeply felt by all who loved him. Lee of Mangum, Oklahoma, married the love of his life and best friend, Rose Gallagher Meeks, on April 1, 1988. Together they built a life centered around love, family, hard work and simple joys. Rose remained his constant companion and greatest blessing throughout his life. He graduated from Mangum in 1964 and continued his education at Southwestern State University, receiving his Bachelor's in 1968. Not suited for idle leisure, vacations during his corporate life as an accountant for Weyerhaeuser were usually spent doing garden projects and home improvements — working with his hands and “playing in the dirt.” Peace and satisfaction were found outside, in a job well done, a fence well hung or a plant well sprung. His retirement plan was always to come home and run cows, just like his father. He did, but also applied his business acumen to the greater good by serving as a director for the Harmon Electric Association, the Greer County Excise Board and the Greer County Conservation Board for many years. Lee — also known as Pops and PopPop — loved driving large farm equipment, tinkering at a workbench and spending time with a rotating pack of dogs. In recent years, he was especially fond of Goose, a black Lab, who followed his every footstep. Nothing mattered more to him than the people he loved. Lee will be remembered as a devoted husband, father and loyal friend whose strength, steady presence and caring heart touched many lives. The only son of

industrious parents Vernon Lee and Maxine (Hopkins) Sparkman, Lee is survived by his loving wife, Rose Sparkman, of the home; two sons, Worth Sparkman and wife Ronie of Fayetteville, Arkansas, and Brent Gates and wife Heather of Selbyville, Delaware; four grandchildren, Blayne Gates and wife Morgan, Gavin Gates, Shane Sparkman, and Gray Sparkman; and his lifelong best friend, Danny Avery. He was preceded in death by his parents Vernon and Maxine Sparkman, and mother-in-law Kelly Meeks. A slow eater — and an even slower storyteller — Lee is missed today and will be forever by those who loved him. The family finds comfort in the memories, laughter and love he leaves behind. His legacy lives on in the lives he touched and the family he cherished.

Services for Lee are set for Saturday, May 23, 2026, 11:00 A.M., Red River Cowboy Church with Pastor Darrell Coffman officiating. Interment will follow in Riverside Cemetery.
