Lois Irene Constant, born February 17, 1941, on a farm southeast of Blackwell, Oklahoma to Olen B. Constant and Eva I. Dodson Constant. She passed from this life to her heavenly life with Jesus on February 6, 2020, at the age of 78 years, 11 months, and 19 days. She was the youngest of three children. As a young girl Lois would ride her horse, Duke, to school as she attended a small country school. In High School her favorite things were learning to type and take shorthand and to this day you will find Christmas lists in shorthand to keep the kids and grandkids from knowing what presents they were sure to get. She liked to spend time climbing trees and playing cowboys and Indians with her brothers. When she was eight years old, she trusted Jesus as her Savior. While in High School she was on the State and National Honor Societies and crowned wrestling queen her senior year. Lois had a love for music and took piano and accordion lessons. Lois excelled in music and was able to attend music contests in Ohio and California. Music was always an important part of her day to day life. She attended Oklahoma Baptist University, where she studied Business and Religious Education. While at OBU Lois married Delbert Leroy Taylor in August 1959, and they continued their education at OBU. In 1961, she and Delbert moved to Fort Worth, Texas to attend Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. Lois was the first woman to study and received a diploma in Theology. While in seminary, Lois and Delbert answered God's call to be foreign missionaries serving 33 years in Colombia and Ecuador, South America where they were

church planters. After retiring in November 2001, they made their home in Mangum where she was active with family, church, and horses.

Lois never missed a moment to share her love for Jesus and horses. Her kind, gentle, and loving heart won all the hearts of those around her. Lois is survived by her daughter Loy Del Sawyer (Johnny) of Bartlesville, daughter Kandy Medlock (George) of Altus, son Lance Taylor (Carisa) of Mangum. She is also survived by her brother Wayne Constant (Janice) of Skiatook. She was blessed with eight grandchildren: Marissa Fitch (Matthew), Kristin Kime (Jared), Matthew Medlock (Jenna), Mandy O'Neil (Justin), Marcus Medlock (Jordan), Andrew, Jordan, and Courtney Taylor. Five great-grandchildren: Taylor, Jack, Lanie, Pearl, and Gunner. She was preceded in death by her husband, father, mother, brother and one great-grandson.

Services for Lois are scheduled for Saturday, February 15, 2020, 3:00 P.M. at the Martha Road Baptist Church. Interment will follow at Riverside Cemetery Mangum, Oklahoma.
