



Peggy Jean Osmond

November 18, 1950 - November 22, 2024

Peggy Jean Osmond passed from this life on November 22, 2024, in Altus, at the age of 74. Peggy was born on November 18, 1950, to Evert and Nevada (Duty) Osmond, in Hobart, Oklahoma. She grew up 2 miles north of Gotebo. Peggy attended Gotebo High School, Paris Jr College in Paris, TX, and East Texas State University, in Commerce, TX. At age 12 she was in the rodeo, barrel racing on thoroughbred, Cindy. Peggy placed first in Gotebo 4-H land judging. She won many awards singing solos at Southwestern interscholastic meets. Peggy spent years being the leader of the pack when nephews, nieces, and cousins came to the Osmond Farm, while big sister, Jill and cousin Joe, ran off. They played dress up, put on plays, played on the creek making pottery from the clay hill, rode horses, swam, climbed trees, and played ghosties in the dark, in the basement. Highschool of '68, Peggy played basketball, was in plays, and sang at her high school graduation solo. At SWOSU, she was a sorority sister in Sigma Kappa and was in beauty pageants, and a life member of Omega Sigma. In '70, Peggy moved to Paris, TX where she was the first recipient of the Bernice Hanks Honorary Art Scholarship, to attend Paris Jr College. In '74, she received her associate's degree from Paris Jr College. Peggy later obtained her bachelor's in education from East TX State University and began her career teaching special education. In 87' Peggy joined her sister in Florida and became a juvenile probation officer. In 95' she moved back to Oklahoma where she taught art at the Hobart Middle School. Peggy enjoyed art, fishing, camping,

the Rockies, music, and acting. She often played roles at the Shortgrass playhouse.

Peggy is survived by her son Dustin Keith Osmond Pomroy and wife Mariel Sarai Pomroy, brother-in-law Larry D Halford, sister Jill Weise and husband Tim, sister in laws Bobby and Beth Osmond, grandchildren Scarlett Rayne Pomroy, Kalli Rose Miller, Logan Keith Pomroy, Kaleb Harris, Karloz Harris, and Kaden Harris.

Peggy is Preceded in death by her parents, brothers Ronald and Leiland Osmond, sisters Greta Greb and Susie Halford, and brother-in-law Charles Greb.

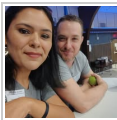

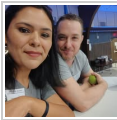
