many different areas. He shared his love of learning with his students and children as a dedicated and dynamic teacher. He never passed up a teachable moment. You always knew where you stood with Mr. Reeves. Aside from teaching, Glenn had a unique ability to build, repair and work with computers. He was always glad to provide technical assistance to anyone in a moment of need.

In summer months, Glenn was also involved with helping with wheat harvest at his family's farm.

Glenn was always known for his quick wit, sense of humor, and a seething hatred of squirrels. This was apparent through his pranks, practical jokes, and frequent squirrel eradication. He also had a love for computer gaming and other games as well. He was a masterful player of Trivial Pursuit and was always looking for worthy opponents.
