Suzanne Michelle Wittmer fulfilled her earthly mission on Saturday, February 29, 2020 just shy of her 90th birthday. A loving wife, mother and grandmother to her family, the immeasurable goodness she brought to the lives of those she loved and all around her will be missed.

Born in Belgrade, Switzerland, Suzanne met a handsome, red-headed US Airman in Fontainebleau, France in 1950 who swept her off her feet and brought her to the States to be married. After their fairytale courtship and marriage, the two traveled the world together raising their daughter, Michelle in many locations. They finally settled in Blair, Oklahoma where she is fondly remembered by many for her 27-year career as the “little French Avon lady.” Suzanne will be remembered for her boundless and unflagging energy—she was always on the “go,” whether working, outside walking, spending time with her daughter and granddaughters, she was our “energizer bunny.” Due to her petite stature, she was almost always in high-heeled shoes--her granddaughters cherish many lovely memories of their “Mémé,” (“Grandma” in French) one of which is that she was always in beautiful, high-heeled shoes. 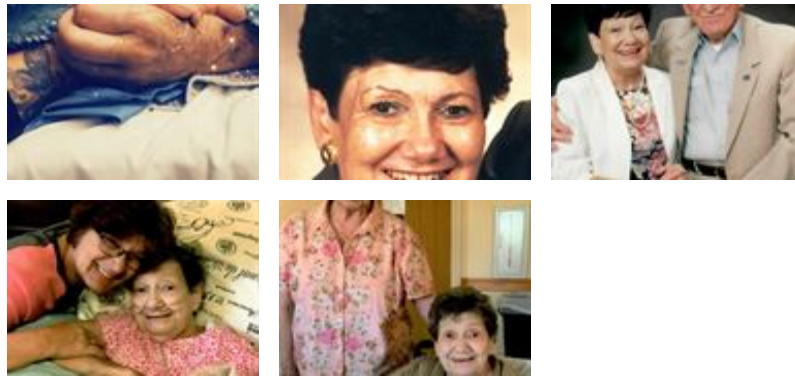

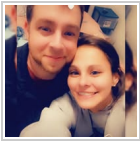
